

**Interpretation**. During the 1960-1980 period, the vote for left-wing parties (labour, social-democrats, socialists, communists, radicals, greens, etc.) was associated to the voters with the lowest income levels; it is still the case in the period 2000-2020, though less strongly so. This general evolution happenned in the U.S. and in Europe, as well as in Canada, Australia and New Zealand.
